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Greeting:

Michael: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Michael: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ
the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

All: And also with you.

Michael: There is one Body and one Spirit;
there is one hope in God's call to us;
one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism;
one God and Father of all.

We gather here today as the Body,
we gather to call down the Spirit upon our brother, Joseph Emanuel,
we gather to affirm our mutual faith in God our loving Father,
and to invite Joseph Emanuel into that faith
through the sacrament of Baptism,
that through the grace of the Holy Spirit
he might grow in the love and wisdom of God,
and through his faith in God
and the Gospel proclaimed by Jesus Christ
he might work to bring about the Reign of God
here amongst God's children.

Reception of the Child:

at the entrance to the chapel

Addressing the parents:

Michael: What name have you given your child?

Parents: **Joseph Emanuel**

Michael: What do you ask for Joseph Emanuel?

Parents: **the faith of Christ and membership in His Body**

Michael: You have asked to have your child baptized.

In doing so you are accepting the responsibility of raising him in a life of faith.

It will be your duty to teach Joseph what God has revealed:

his covenant, his commandments, and his Gospel.

It will be your duty to help him to know God,

to feel his love, and to love him with his whole heart, mind and soul.

It will be your duty to teach him, by example,

to love and care for his neighbors *and enemies*

as he loves himself.

It will be your duty to teach Joseph

that God nourishes us for this sacred mission

through the communal life of his Body, the Church,

especially through the celebration of the sacraments.

Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?

Parents: **We do.**

Addressing the sponsors:

Michael: Are you ready to help the parents of this child in their duty as Christian parents?

Sponsors: **We are.**

Addressing Joseph:

Michael: Joseph Emanuel, the Christian community welcomes you with great joy.

In the name of the Church

I claim you for Christ our Savior by the sign of his cross.

I now trace the cross on your forehead,

and invite your parents and godparents to do the same.

Opening Prayer (Ritual Mass of Baptism 2):

Michael: Let us pray.

Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go with him for two miles.

Give to the one who asks of you,
and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow.

But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you
may be children of your heavenly Father,

RITE OF BAPTISM

(Priests, Joseph, parents and godparents gather around the baptismal font)

General Intercessions / Prayer of the Faithful:

Michael: My dear brothers and sisters, let us ask our Lord Jesus Christ to look lovingly on this child who is to be baptized, on his family and godparents, and on all the people your son has gained for you through this holy sacrament of baptism.

By the mystery of your death and resurrection, bathe this child in light, give him the new life of baptism and welcome him into your holy Church.

Michael: Deliver him, O Lord, from the way of sin and death – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Fill him with your holy and life-giving Spirit – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Keep him in the faith and communion of your Holy Church – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Teach him to love others in the power of the Spirit – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Send him into the world in witness to the Gospel of your love – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Bring him to the fullness of your peace and glory – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Make the lives of his parents and godparents examples of faith to inspire this child – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Keep his family always in your love – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Renew the grace of our baptism in each of one of us here – we pray.

All: Lord, hear our prayer

Michael: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.

All: Amen.

Prayer of Exorcism and Anointing before Baptism

Michael: Almighty and ever-living God,
you sent your only Son into the world
to cast out the power of Satan, the spirit of evil,
to rescue humanity from the kingdom of darkness,
and bring us into the splendor of your kingdom of light.
We pray for this child:
set him free from original sin,
make him a temple of your glory,
and send your Holy Spirit to dwell with him.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

Michael: We anoint you with the oil of salvation
in the name of Christ our Savior;
may he strengthen you
with his power,
who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All: Amen

(Michael anoints the child on the breast with oil of catechumens and lays his hand on the child in silence)

Blessing and Invocation of God over the Baptismal Water:

Michael: My dear brothers and sisters,
God uses the sacrament of water to give his divine life
to those who believe in him.
Let us turn to him, and to ask him to pour his gift of life
from this font on this child he has chosen.

Michael: Father, you give us grace through sacramental signs,
which tell us of the wonders of your unseen power.

In baptism we use your gift of water,
which you have made a rich symbol of the grace you give us in this
sacrament.

At the very dawn of creation
your Spirit breathed on the waters making them the wellspring of all holiness.

The waters of the great flood
you made a sign of the waters of baptism,
that make an end of sin and a new beginning of goodness.

Through the waters of the Red Sea
you led the children of Israel out of bondage,
to be an image of God's holy people,
set free from sin by baptism.

In the waters of the Jordan
your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit.

Your Son willed that water and blood should flow from his side
as he hung on the cross.

After the resurrection he told his disciples:
"Go out and teach all nations,
baptizing them in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Father, look now with love upon your Church,
and unseal for her the fountain of baptism.

By the power of the Spirit give to the water of this font the grace of your son.

You created humanity in your own likeness:
cleansing us from sin in a new birth to innocence by water and the Spirit.

(Michael touches the water with his right hand and continues)

We ask you, Father, with your Son
to send the Holy Spirit upon the water of this font.
May all who are buried with Christ in the death of baptism
rise also with him to newness of life.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen

Renunciation of Sin and Profession of Faith

(addressing the parents and godparents)

Michael: Dear parents and godparents:
You have come here to present this child for baptism.
By water and the Holy Spirit he is to receive the gift of new life from God, who is love.

On your part,
you must make it your constant care to bring him up in the practice of the faith.
See that the divine life which God gives him is kept safe from the poison of sin,
to grow always stronger in his heart.

If your faith makes you ready to accept this responsibility,
renew now the vows of your own baptism.
Reject sin; profess your faith in Christ Jesus.
This is the faith of the Church.
This is the faith in which this child about to be baptized.

Michael: Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of God's children?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: Do you reject the glamour of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: Do you reject Satan, father of sin and prince of darkness?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died, and was buried,
rose from the dead, and is now seated at the right of the Father?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?
Parents and Godparents: I do

Michael: This is our faith.
This is the faith of the Church.
We are proud to profess it, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

All: Amen

The Baptism:

Michael: Is it your will that Joseph Emanuel be baptized in the faith of the Church, which we have all professed with you?

Parents and Godparents: It is

(Melissa holds Joseph and Michael baptizes him saying)

Michael: Joseph Emanuel, I baptize you in the name of the Father

(Michael pours water upon him)

Michael: and of the Son

(Michael pours water upon him)

Michael: and of the Holy Spirit.

(Michael pours water upon him)

Anointing with Chrism:

Michael: God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into his holy people.

He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation.

As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King,

so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life.

All: Amen

(Michael anoints the child on the crown of the head with the sacred chrism)

Clothing with the White Garment:

Michael: Joseph Emanuel, you have become a new creation, and have clothed yourself in Christ.

See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity.

With your family and friends to help you by word and example,

bring the dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven.

All: Amen

(Joseph will be wrapped in the white blanket made by his great-grandmother)

Presentation of the Lighted Candle:

Michael: Receive the light of Christ.

(Toby lights the baptismal candle from the paschal candle while Michael says)

Michael: Parents and godparents,
this light is entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly.
This child of yours has been enlightened by Christ.
He is to walk always as a child of the light.
May he keep the flame of faith alive in his heart.
When the Lord comes, may he go out to meet him
with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom.

Ephphetha – Prayer over the Ears and Mouth:

(Michael touches the ears and mouth of the child with his thumb, saying)

Michael: The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak.
May he soon touch your ears to receive his word,
and your mouth to proclaim his faith,
to the praise and glory of God the Father.

All: Amen

Conclusion of the Rite:

Michael: You have put on Christ
in him you have been baptized.
Alleluia! Alleluia!

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Presentation of the Gifts / Preparation of the Altar:

NO HYMN DURING THE OFFERTORY

Joseph, his parents and godparents will bring up the gifts of bread, wine, and a monetary offering for St. Ann's Maternity Home.

Michael: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this bread to offer,
which earth has given and human hands have made.
It will become for us the bread of life.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Michael (inaudibly): By the mystery of this water and wine
may we come to share in the divinity of Christ,
who humbled himself to share in our humanity.

Michael: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation.
Through your goodness we have this wine to offer,
fruit of the vine and work of human hands.
It will become our spiritual drink.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Michael (inaudibly): Lord God, we ask you to receive us
and be pleased with the sacrifice we offer you
with humble and contrite hearts.

Michael (inaudibly): Lord, wash away my iniquity;
cleanse me of my sins.

Michael: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that our sacrifice
may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands,
for the praise and glory of his name,
for our good, and the good of all his Church.



Prayer over the Gifts:

Michael: Lord.

you have renewed your son Joseph
in the likeness of Christ your Son
and united him to your priestly people.
Accept him with the sacrifice offered by your Church.
Grant this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs and Occasions IV:

Jesus the Compassion of God

Michael: It is truly right to give you thanks,
it is fitting that we offer you praise,
Father of mercy, faithful God.
You sent Jesus Christ your Son among us
as redeemer and Lord.
He was moved with compassion
for the poor and the powerless,
for the sick and the sinner;
he made himself neighbor to the oppressed.
By his words and actions he proclaimed to the world
that you care for us
as a father cares for his children.
And so, with all the angels and saints
we sing the joyful hymn of your praise:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Michael: You are truly blessed, O God of holiness:

Michael (with concelebrants): Great and merciful Father,
we ask you to send down your Holy Spirit
to hallow these gifts of bread and wine,
that they may become for us

the body ✠ and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ.



Institution Narrative

Michael (with concelebrants):

On the eve of his passion and death,
while at table with those he loved,

he took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke the bread,
gave it to his disciples, and said:

*Take this, all of you, and eat it:
this is my body which will be given up for you.*

When supper was ended, he took the cup;

again he gave you thanks
and, handing the cup to his disciples, he said:

*Take this, all of you, and drink from it:
this is the cup of my blood,
the blood of the new and everlasting covenant.
It will be shed for you and for all
so that sins may be forgiven.*

Do this in memory of me.

Memorial Acclamation:

Michael: Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

All: Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Anamnesis and Offering:

Michael (with concelebrants):

And so, Father most holy,
we celebrate the memory of Christ, your Son,
whom you led through suffering and death on the cross
to the glory of the resurrection
and a place at your right hand.
Until Jesus, our Savior, comes again,
we proclaim the work of your love,
and we offer you the bread of life
and the cup of eternal blessing.

Look with favor on the offering of your Church
in which we show forth the paschal sacrifice of Christ
entrusted to us.

Through the power of your Spirit of love
include us now and for ever
among the members of your Son,
whose body and blood we share.

Michael:

Lord,
perfect your Church in faith and love
together with **Benedict** our pope, **Donald** our bishop,
with all bishops, priests, and deacons,
and all those your Son has gained for you.

Strengthen Joseph who has now become one of your people
by the waters of rebirth.
Help him to walk in the newness of life.

Open our eyes to the needs of all;
inspire us with words and deeds
to comfort those who labor
and are burdened;

keep our service of others
faithful to the example and command of Christ.



Let your Church be a living witness
to truth and freedom, to justice and peace,
that all people may be lifted up
by the hope of a world made new.

Michael (or another concelebrant):

Be mindful of our brothers and sisters
Eduardo, Margaret, Michael, Merritt, Catherine, and John,
who have fallen asleep in the peace of Christ,
and all the dead whose faith only you can know.
Lead them to the fullness of the resurrection
and gladden them with the light of your face.

When our pilgrimage on earth is complete,
welcome us into your heavenly home,
where we shall dwell with you for ever.
There, with Mary, the Virgin Mother of God,
with the apostles, the martyrs,
Saints Francis, Clare, Lawrence, Camillus and all the saints,
we shall praise you and give you glory

Michael (with concelebrants): through Jesus Christ, your Son.

Doxology and Great Amen:

Michael: Through him, with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
